The STEM Ambassador Program (STEMAP) is a research and public engagement program funded by the National Science Foundation. It is housed in the Biology Department at the University of Utah. Our goal is to improve multi-way communication between scientists and the public, particularly public audiences outside of traditional scientific fields.

Scientists from a variety of disciplines are trained through STEMAP to become “ambassadors” for their work. We identify common interests and values between STEM Ambassadors and appropriate community groups, and facilitate engagement events. These events include lectures, demonstrations, citizen science programs, social media, and written materials.
